The Brogo Rural Fire Brigades Area of Activity includes part of the Princes Highway, and as well as looking after Residents with House Fires, Bushfires and Hazard Reduction Work, about half of their services include many Motor Vehicle and Truck Accidents on the Highway. Due to these Accidents they need extra space in the Brogo Fire Station for a larger Fire Truck to handle these Highway Incidents, and the Brogo Rural Fire Brigade Volunteers hope enough funds will be raised from the function to carry out this work.
